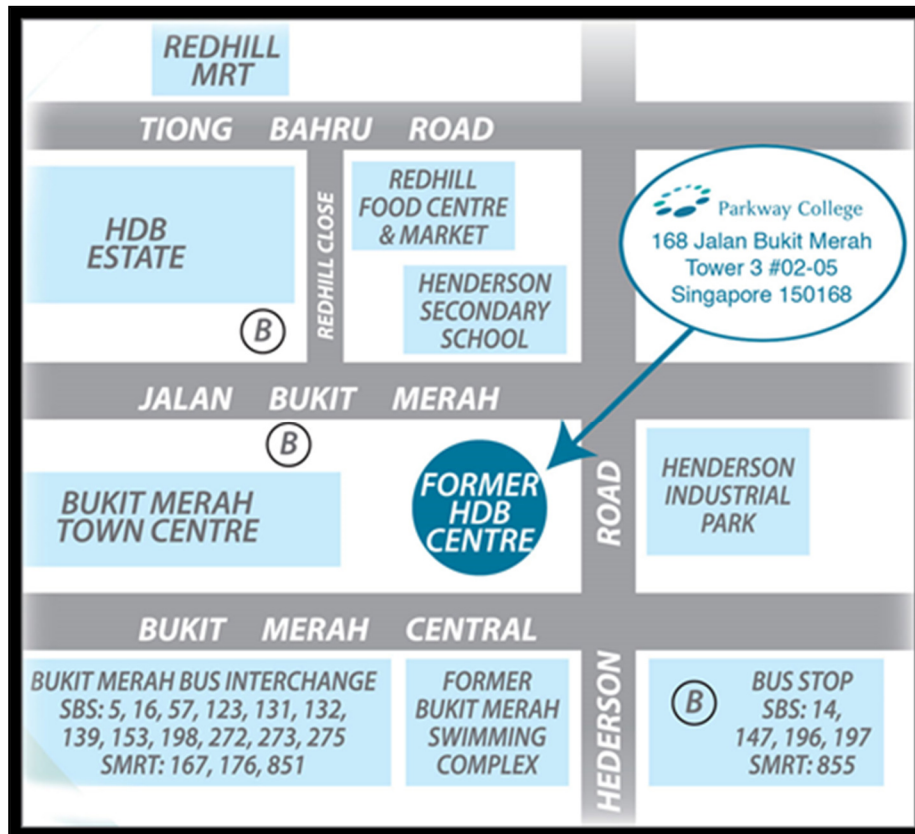

COURSE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Eligibility Requirements

Candidates must be a Singapore Citizen or Singapore Permanent Resident, and be 18 years and above, and meet the Academic and Health Requirements to apply.

Academic Requirements

For 'A' Level Graduates:

- Minimum of 5 GCE 'O' level passes with English, Mathematics and Science, AND
- GCE 'A' level (or equivalent) with at least one Science at 'A' level, with an overall UCAS Tariff System score of 120*

For Diploma/Degree Holders:

- Minimum of 5 GCE 'O' level passes with English, Mathematics and Science, OR
- Completion of Polytechnic Foundation Programme with at least C+ for English modules, AND
- Degree or Polytechnic Diploma in the Science field, with at least a GPA of 2.5*

The following can be accepted in place of GCE 'O' level English:

IELTS – Minimum score of 6.5 for each component and an overall score of 7.0 across all components.

* Applicants who do not meet the academic requirements will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.

Health Requirements

Due to the unique requirements of healthcare professions, all applicants should be free from physical handicap and are required to undergo medical examination before they can be enrolled into the programme.

While not exhaustive, the following conditions may result in non-acceptance into the programme:

- HBsAG positive / Hepatitis B carrier
- Positive Hepatitis C antibody
- Positive HIV antibody
- Acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS)

Other Requirements

- Candidates are required to attend and pass the selection process before they can be enrolled into the programme.
- The selection process will take place after the submission of the Application Form and required documents. Successful candidates will proceed to undergo medical examination and submit a medical examination report.

COURSE ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE

The Course Assessment Schedule will be given to the students on the first day of class, together with the Module Guides.

GRADING SYSTEM

The University adopts a 4.50 GPA system, in parallel with the Honours Degree Classification system. The students will receive both a degree classification and a GPA score.

The University uses a numeric scale for marking. The pass mark is 40% at Year 1, 2 and 3. Students cannot be reassessed for a component of assessment if they have already passed that component purely for the purpose of improving the grade achieved. All elements of assessment within a module are combined to give an overall mark for the module. Most work is assessed using a specified grading criteria, whereas some work is assessed as pass / fail (e.g. practice documents). The grading system will be provided to the students during the assessment guidance sessions.

TUITION FEE

S\$77,698 (inclusive of the prevailing GST)

The tuition fee is to be paid by semester instalment. With a total of 3 semesters in a year, the tuition fee for the programme is to be paid in a total of 9 instalments across 3 years. Please note that the fee does not include the application fee, enrolment fee, Fee Protection Scheme (FPS) premium, National Environment Agency (NEA) radiation license registration fee, medical insurance premium and miscellaneous fees, e.g. laboratory coat, and anatomical markers.

ADVISORY NOTE

This note is for a prospective student of the BSc (Hons) in Diagnostic Radiography and Imaging Course.

Compliance for Clinical Placement

Students should adhere to the following requirements throughout the course of study:

1. Students are not allowed to have tattoo and body art which can be seen when the uniform is worn during clinical placement.
2. Students are not allowed to wear hijab or head scarf during clinical placement for infection control purposes.
3. Students should note that the course fee is a significant amount which is payable before the start of every semester. Upon payment of the course fee for each semester, students will then be allowed to proceed with clinical placement and classes for the semester.



MEDICAL EXAMINATION

1) Local and International applicants for Nursing and Radiography courses are required to undergo health screening and immunization to determine their health status and reduce the risk of vaccine-preventable diseases for students who are at risk of exposure to and possible transmission of these infections. The cost of the medical examination shall be borne by the student.

2) As per course admission procedures, the applicant will have to submit the completed SA04 – Medical Examination Report.

a. For applicants in Singapore, the medical examination must be done in Singapore by any registered medical practitioner.

b. International applicants will complete the medical examination in their home countries/places of residence at any medical clinic licensed to carry out such tests.

c. International students who are accepted for the course will undergo the Medical Examination again in a clinic in Singapore after they have arrived here for the course.

3) The pre-enrolment medical examination will consist of the following, but not exhaustive:

- Hepatitis B Surface Anti-body (Anti-HBs)
- Hepatitis B Surface Antigen (HBsAg)
- Hepatitis C (Anti-HCV)
- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV Test)
- TB (Chest X-ray)
- Varicella IgG
- Rubella IgG
- Urine labstick (protein, sugar and pregnancy test – for female student only)

Note: Ladies are advised to go for the medical checkup after their period as a urine test is required.

4) The original of the laboratory reports must be attached to the Parkway College Medical Examination Report.

ABOUT COMMITTEE FOR PRIVATE EDUCATION (CPE)

The Committee for Private Education (CPE) was appointed by SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG) Board in October 2016 to carry out its functions and powers relating to private education under the Private Education Act. The CPE is supported by a team of dedicated staff from SSG to regulate the sector, provide student services, consumer education and facilitate capability development efforts to uplift standards in the local private education industry.

Parkway College is registered with CPE, and has been awarded the prestigious 4-year EduTrust award by CPE.

STUDENT CONTRACT

The PEI – Student Contract is a legally binding contract between Parkway College and its students that embodies the following mandatory requirements:

- a. Clear definition of course details – course title, pre-requisites, qualification awarded, course duration;
- b. Full disclosure of course fees and miscellaneous fees;
- c. Clear definition of refund policies; and
- d. Clear definition of dispute resolution mechanisms.

FEE PROTECTION SCHEME (FPS)

Under EduTrust for Education, Parkway College will provide a Fee Protection Scheme (FPS) for both local and international students enrolled by the Private Education Institution (PEI).

The FPS serves to protect unconsumed course fees paid by students in the event a PEI is unable to continue operating due to insolvency, and/or regulatory closure. The FPS also protects students if the PEI fails to pay penalties or return fees to the students arising from judgement made against it by the Singapore courts.

EduTrust-certified PEIs are required to adopt the FPS to provide full protection to all fees paid by their students. All fees refer to all monies paid by the students to be enrolled in a PEI, excluding the course application fee, agent commission fee (if applicable), miscellaneous fees (non-compulsory and non-standard fee paid only when necessary or where applicable, for example, the re-exam fee or charges for credit card payment etc,) and GST.

Parkway College working with the insurer, Lonpac Insurance Bhd, has put in place an Insurance Scheme as its FPS for international and local students.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

The Group Hospitalisation and Surgical Insurance (GHS), Outpatient and the Group Personal Accident (GPA) Insurance offered by Parkway College's selected provider are mandatory for all nursing and radiography students at Parkway College.

Students who purchase the group insurance are eligible to utilise the health services at the various GP clinics and hospitals offered by Parkway College's selected provider.

Note: Identification card and e-medical card must be presented for each visit at the GP clinic.

Before consulting a specialist from a government hospital, students will have to get a referral letter from any of the approved panel of clinic doctors. The student will have to make full payment for the specialist or procedural charges before seeking a claim from the insurance by submitting a form which is obtained from the Student Admin. All bills and receipts must be attached to the form before submitting for claims.

 - S\$30,000 annual limit per person (As Charged)
 - B1 Ward entitlement (Government/Restructured hospitals)
 - Clinical placement/attachment coverage

 - \$ limit per visit (Panel) – As charged
 - Number of visits per year per insured – Unlimited
 - Medication – Standard
 - Co-payment – S\$5
- Outpatient SP – Specialist Care (referral letter from GP)
 - Annual limit per person – S\$500
 - Specialist consultation – Covered
 - X-ray & Laboratory Tests – Covered
 - \$ limit per visit – As charged
 - Co-payment – Nil
- Group Personal Accident Insurance Policy
 - Sum insured per student S\$20,000
 - Death and permanent disablement
